2011 is Project Share's twelfth year of operation. Last year, Project Share provided toys for 1400 children. Families who receive the toys are identified through the local schools. In addition to the holiday toy drive, Project Share has a monthly food distribution that provides groceries to families in need.

"Every year, Project Share has grown," said Stocker. "This year, we expect the need to be greater than ever so more toys and cash donations will be needed. There are many ways to help.
